


Precincts, Parks, Ruins: The Archaeology of Ecclesiastical Landscapes



A Joint Conference to be held in Exeter Friday 15th – Sunday 17th September 2006

This year's conference focuses on places of worship in relation to their wider surrounding human and physical contexts. The ideas and beliefs which shaped both social and sacred changes in ecclesiastical landscapes, and the role of religious centres in influencing these changes, are considered through the findings of excavation work, analytical investigation and academic studies. Some of this work has only recently been undertaken and the meeting will provide the opportunity for new discoveries, research and insights to be outlined.

The weekend will commence late Friday afternoon with guided tours around Exeter Cathedral, including the roof, which is not normally open to the public. There will also be the opportunity to attend Evensong. The Saturday programme comprises a fascinating line-up of speakers, and will include the Annual General Meeting of the Society for Church Archaeology in the morning, and that of the Association of Diocesan and Cathedral Archaeologists in the afternoon. The Conference Dinner will be held on the Saturday evening in the Redvers Suite of the Queen's Court Hotel close to Exeter City Centre. The Sunday field trip will include guided tours around St.Mary's, Totnes, Buckfast Abbey and also Holy Trinity Church at Buckfastleigh, all of which are considered in detail by speakers on the Saturday afternoon.

The Loop Centre (South West Conference Centre Ltd, Bittern Road, Sowton, Exeter) is located on the outskirts of the City, a short distance to the west of the M5, & easily accessible from either junction 29 (via the A3015 Honiton Road) or from junction 30. The Centre offers plentiful, free car-parking space, & lies immediately adjacent to the Honiton Park & Ride. There is a frequent bus service from Exeter City Centre along the Honiton Road, & also to the Honiton Park & Ride. There are taxi ranks which lie immediately outside the main Exeter St.David's Station, & several in the City Centre itself. The Loop Centre lies 3½ miles southeast of St.David's Station (15 minutes by taxi). Digby & Sowton station is situated just to the south of the Centre (5 minutes by taxi), but train services here are infrequent.
